# **Estonian Development Plan of Agriculture and Fisheries 2030**

Engle strategic development document for the sectors and developing the programs, measures and activities necessary for its implementation:

- contribute to the development and competitiveness of Estonian agriculture, fisheries, aquaculture and food industry, balanced development of rural and coastal areas, maintaining good plant and animal health, ensuring food safety and preserving a clean environment and species diversity
- Responsible ministry: the Ministry of Rural Affairs
- Other ministries (Ministry of the Environment, Ministry of Social Affairs, Ministry of Economic Affairs and Communications, Ministry of Education and Research, Ministry of Finance) and the State Chancellery participate
- Partners and stakeholders in the field are involved

# **DPAF 2030 (***draft***)**

#### Vision 2030

Estonian food is valued and it is good to live in the countryside

#### **Overall objective**

Estonian food is preferred, the environment and biodiversity are preserved, food businesses are successful and rural and coastal communities are viable

#### **SUB-OBJECTIVE**

Smart and sustainable agriculture, food production and rural life, and safe food and a protected environment



#### **SUB-OBJECTIVE**

Sustainable fisheries that ensure the competitiveness of the fisheries sector and the sustainable management of fish stocks

Bioeconomy, exports, environment and comprehensive rural development ...

## DPAF 2030 and bioeconomy

- Estonia has the opportunity to meet the growing global demand for food, feed, bioenergy, biomaterials and other products based on bioresources
  - ✓ Biggest bottleneck is low added value
  - ▼ The principles of the circular economy are not yet widespread
- To realize this potential, effective cross-sectoral cooperation and the agreement of strategic developments at national level are important
- Support should be given to drawing up more specific bioeconomy operational programs at regional level, based on local specificities and regional resources and their location

## DPAF 2030 and bioeconomy

- Contribute to the development of the bioeconomy primarily in the value chains related to agriculture, fisheries, aquaculture and the food industry
- One important direction of the bioeconomy is the use of residues and by-products as a valuable resource
- Aquaculture and marine farming also has great development potential
- Efforts should also be made to set up biorefineries suitable for primary producers by supporting the necessary development activities, including pilot and demonstration projects -> greener and more cost-effective industrial base and new jobs



#### VISION 2030

 Through the governmental initiative, CEE countries set the vision for 2030: to develop knowledge and cooperation based circular bioeconomies, which helps to enhance their inclusive growth and to create new value-added jobs especially in rural areas, maintaining or even strengthening environmental sustainability

#### **MISSION:**

to assist CEE countries to operationalize their Vision for 2030 drawing on their potential and offering opportunities for:

- sustainable increase of biomass production
- circular ("zero waste") processing of the available biomass
- viable rural areas

# BIOEASTsUP - Advancing Sustainable Circular Bioeconomy in CEE countries

Coordination and Support Action in Horizon 2020

- Start: 1 October 2019 End: 30 September 2022
- Budget: 3 M€
- Coordinator: IUNG (Poland)
- 21 partners from 11 countries:
  - 11 BIOEAST countries + DE and Fi
  - 4 Ministries
  - 14 Research Institutes
  - 3 SMEs
